**Weather:** Temperature range: -2 to 8 deg F. Winds westerly - southwesterly, 7-12 mph. Partly to mostly cloudy. Snow depth 5 inches.

**Conditions:** Excellent crop of crabapples and mountain ash. Cone crop fair. Sunflowers and corn mostly harvested. Small patches of open water were present below the dams on the Red and Red Lake Rivers, and Grand Forks lagoons.

## **Comments:**

This was the 50th consecutive year for this count in its present location. The count was conducted under very good conditions with little wind and moderate temperatures. Most of the minimum-maintenance roads could be driven. The total of 30 Rough-legged Hawks was just short of the record count of 31. Cooper's Hawk was reported for the third time, and Northern Saw-whet Owl for the 4th time. This was not a particularly good year for rare vagrants or overwintering semi-hardy species. A Snowy Owl was seen by Lyla Odstrcil on the last day of count week, which kept alive the streak of this species being seen count day or count week every year beginning in 1970.
