Species Summary: On count day, total of 45 species plus 1 race (Oregon Junco). Seven additional count week species giving a total of 52 species. Total number of individuals = 4590.

Observers: 22 observers in field in 13 parties (5 observers in 2 parties in MN, 17 observers in 11 parties in ND), plus 14 observers at feeders (3 in MN, 12 in ND).

Time and Distance: Starting Time 8:00 AM, End Time 5:15 P.M. 38.75 hours watching feeders. Total party-hours = 68.25 and total party miles = 609.25 (17.5 hours and 21.9) miles on foot; 48.25 hours and 563.05 miles by car; 2.5 hour and 25 miles nocturnal birding ("owling")).

Weather: Temperature range: 34 to 37 deg F. No wind in early morning, northerly up to 12 mph by late afternoon. Heavy fog all day. No snow on ground. Still water was frozen. There were areas of open water in Kellys Slough, Grand Forks Lagoons, below Riverside Dam on Red River, below dam on Red Lake River, and Crystal Sugar lagoons in MN.

Comments:

Count Day was conducted in heavy fog. There was no snow cover which allowed all minimum maintenance roads to be traversed, and considerable time spent walking, especially along the Greenway. The preceding week had been unusually warm, but this warm period was preceded by unseasonable cold in November. All fields of corn and sunflower had been harvested, but some fields had not been plowed under.

This was the 54th Grand Forks – East Grand Forks CBC. The most unusual species were: Cackling Goose – 3rd record in last four years, after the recent split from Canada Goose.

Northern Pintail -- 2nd CBC record the other record was in 1999

Ruddy Duck -- 1st CBC record, found at the Crystal Sugar ponds where there is a warm water discharge

Northern Goshawk -- photographed

Barred Owl -3^{rd} record for the count

Varied Thrush -- 5th record for the count

A Sharp-shinned Hawk was at Sandy Aubol's feeder both before and after count week. Merlin was missed for the first year since 1987. The 87 House Finches was the lowest since 1993, which was soon after they became established in Grand Forks. The decline of House Sparrows continues. This year's total of 403 House Sparrows is the lowest in over 40 years and is far below the high of 7334 in 1989. Earlier low numbers may have been due to low number of counters. No American Goldfinches were reported, and all redpolls seen were in open country and not at feeding stations.
